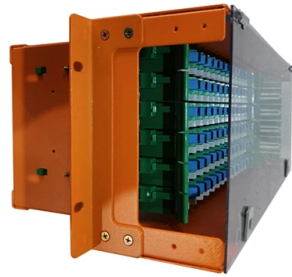


Cable trays passing through walls on the ground

Cable trays and busways at floor level or at slab penetrations shall have a waterstop no less than 50 mm in height. Sealing shall be tight and reliable, without visible cracks or. Scope: Firestopping for busway, cable trays, cables, and trunking passing through walls in enclosed electrical installations. The metal in cable trays may be used as the EGC as per the limitations. Practices for grounding and bonding of cable trays

All metallic cable trays shall be grounded as required in Article 250.96 regardless of whether or not the cable tray is being used as an equipment grounding conductor (EGC).
