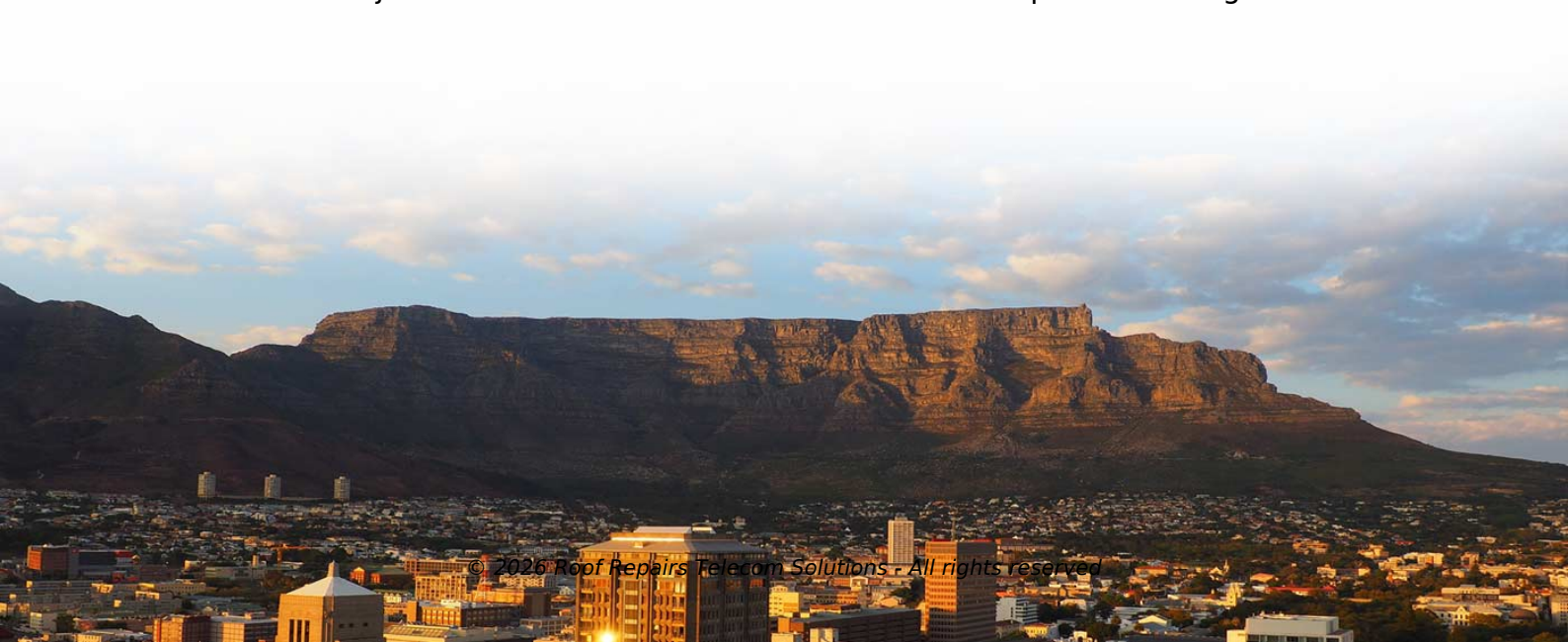


Cold splice for cables that do not require inserts



Overview

Quick splice connectors, also known as splice taps, tap connectors, or colloquially as "quick connects," are specialized electrical components designed to create temporary or permanent connections between wires without requiring full stripping or cutting of both conductors. We chose this method because we feel it performs the best and is the most reliable. The electrode in all our splices is designed with tolerances to cover the gap between the connector and cable insulation, connector growth from crimping, B h mastic and covering the connector with high dielectric materials. Our 3M™ Cold Shrink Technology offers a superior alternative to traditional heat shrink or pre-molded cable joints/splices and terminations that can be installed in a fraction of time - without the need for equipment, tools, or permits. Then squeeze down with parallel-jaw or slip joint pliers - don't use needle-noses, they have too much. The cold shrink cable splice body is a one-piece moulded design made of specially formulated silicone rubber, while the cold shrink jacketing is made of EPDM rubber for physical protection of the installed cable joint. There are several methods for how to splice wires together.
