For optimal performance, such physical obstructions interfere with the Wi-Fi signal and often result in reduced signal strength and lower data throughput, particularly in areas that are geographically distant or separated by multiple structural barriers from the router. Here are some common router placement mistakes to avoid. That entertainment center or kitchen cabinet might seem like the perfect hiding spot for your router, but you're essentially building a signal prison. Wi-Fi signals need open space to travel effectively, and enclosed areas create barriers that weaken the signal before it even leaves the immediate. In the cabinet, connect the cable associated with the wall outlet to the little white AT&T box (disconnect the cable with red connector). Now your Wi-Fi signal will distribute better. Leave the AT&T equipment where it is. You might be paying for the best internet. The only answer is to try both locations (and other locations if possible) to determine the resulting wireless performance. Do not jump to any immediate conclusions.
