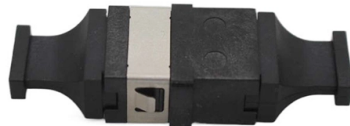

Fiber Type

Single-mode vs. Multimode: Single-mode fiber (OS2) has a narrow 9/125 μm core, allowing light to travel in a single path, making it ideal for long-distance transmission up to 120 km with low attenuation and high bandwidth potential, commonly used in telecom and enterprise backbones. Multimode fiber (OM1, OM2, OM3, OM4, OM5) has a larger core, supporting multiple light paths, suitable for short-distance applications like data centers and LANs. OM3 and OM4 are optimized for 10G-100G Ethernet over hundreds of meters, while OM5 supports wideband multimode for future-proofing high-speed networks.

Connector Types

Patch cords are terminated with connectors that ensure precise optical alignment. Common types include:

- LC (Lucent Connector): Small form factor, push-pull mechanism, widely used in high-density data centers.
- SC (Subscriber Connector): Square, snap-in design, common in PON and enterprise networks.
- FC (Ferrule Connector): Bayonet mount, used in telecom and test equipment.
