

How to correctly connect the neutral and ground wires of the distribution box

Neutral and ground wires should only be bonded in the main service panel; in a distribution box or subpanel, they must remain separate for safety.

Key Principles

Neutral Wire: The neutral wire completes the electrical circuit and carries current under normal operation. It should be connected to the neutral busbar in the distribution box, which distributes the return path to all branch circuits . **Ground Wire:** The ground wire is a safety conductor that carries current only during a fault. It should be connected to the ground busbar (PE bar) in the distribution box, which is linked to the building's grounding system . **Separation Rule:** According to NEC Article 250, neutral and ground wires must only be bonded at the main service panel or first service disconnect. In subpanels or downstream distribution boxes, neutral and ground must remain separate to prevent unwanted current on grounding paths, which could create shock hazards or interfere with protective devices .

Step-by-Step Connection in a Distribution Box

- **Prepare Materials and Tools:** Use neutral and ground busbars, insulated copper wires, screwdrivers, wire strippers, and multimeters. Ensure wire sizes match the load and design specifications .
- **Install Neutral Busbar:** Mount the neutral busbar securely inside the distribution box. Strip the insulation of incoming neutral wires (10-15 mm), insert them into the busbar terminals, and tighten screws. Connect outgoing branch circuit neutrals similarly, one wire per terminal .
