

Safety Requirements for Mesh Cable Trays

Regulatory Compliance

Mesh cable trays are governed by OSHA regulations (29 CFR 1910.305(a)(3)), which require employers to provide a workplace free from recognized electrical hazards, including shock, arc-flash, and fire risks (OSHA) . Compliance with the National Electrical Code (NEC) Article 392 is essential for grounding and bonding, although NEC provisions are advisory unless adopted by local law . Additionally, NEMA standards such as VE 1, VE 2, and BI 50015 define construction, load capacity, dimensions, and installation practices for metallic and wire mesh cable trays .

Grounding and Bonding

Proper grounding and bonding are critical for mesh cable trays because metallic trays can become energized under fault conditions. Key requirements include:

- Ensuring electrical continuity across all tray sections, including splice points, to create a continuous conductive path .
- Connecting the tray system to the building grounding electrode system to provide a safe path for fault current .
- Using properly sized grounding conductors according to NEC tables, especially when trays serve as equipment grounding conductors (EGC)
