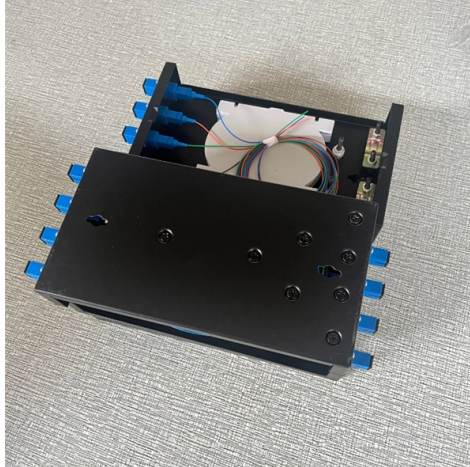

- **Protective Earth (PE):** If residual current protection is used, the PE wire must connect to the ground busbar to ensure protection against earth faults . This configuration ensures that the live wire is interrupted during a fault while the neutral remains continuous, which is standard for single-phase residential circuits.
